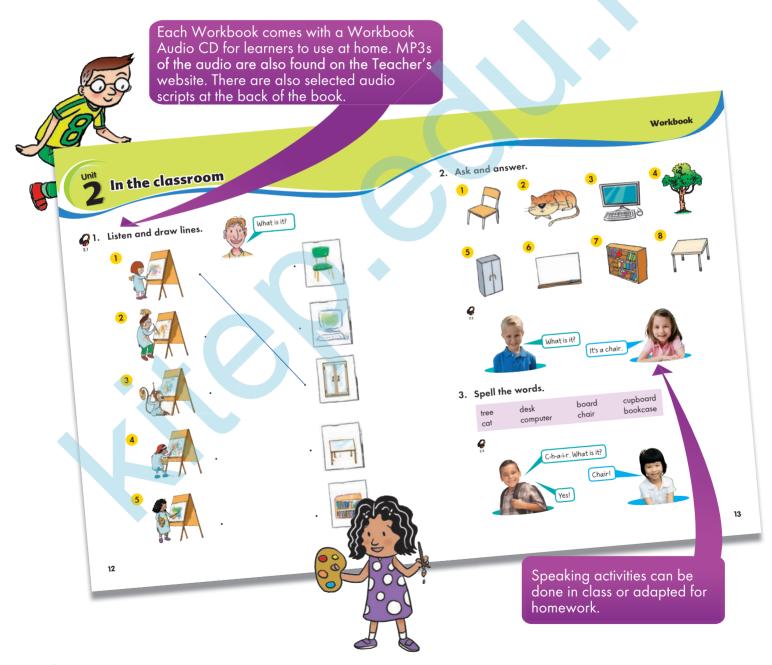

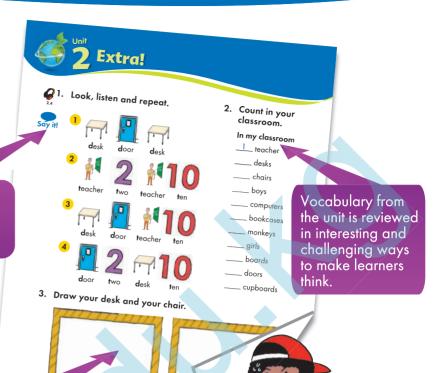
Take Off with English 4 and 5 are perfect for all primary English classes but also fully develop learners' communication skills for the Cambridge English: Starters test syllabus.
